

Challenges of The Kingdom

Love Without Hypocrisy

If love is to desire and work towards the well-being of all people, then to not do so is to fail to love. If we as believers and as those who claim to be Christ's followers, fail to love while preaching love, then we are hypocrites. I have heard more than once that people who can't stand Christians cite hypocrisy as a major reason. Hypocrisy because Christians are expected to act a particular way and do not. It's funny how a non-believer knows exactly how a Christian is expected to carry themselves according to the bible. A Christian cannot hide. We are known to the world! No human being is perfect of course, but that is the world's expectation. Therefore we should strive to love without hypocrisy. But such love is a challenge for us.

What does it mean to desire the well-being of all people? What a loaded question to answer! I will begin with Romans 13:8-10 which tells us that love is the absolute key to being. According to Paul there is nothing else. All other facets of life take an extreme backseat, including yourself, so head to the back of the longest bus in the universe and place everyone else ahead of you. Paul says that /Fyou are loving, then you can never do anything wrong to anyone. It would be impossible. This includes, but is not limited to, deeds, actions, thoughts, and every emotion under the sun. No wrong. However, we obviously do wrong to many people throughout our lives whether we are believers or not and the wrongs come in various sizes and schemes. So, does this mean that there is no love in us? In Romans 5, Paul says that God pours His love into our hearts, a non-stop, massive gushing of love. Think of standing, mouth open, head tilted up, under the Canadian side of Niagara Falls, the Horseshoe Falls. It fills you up and immediately begins to pour out of you! And so, there is love in us! There is so much love that it is immeasurable! This is the love we are to emulate. Paul continues in Romans 12:10-11, that we must not be lazy with this love. Laziness with love breeds hypocrisy. We cannot lag behind. We must always be diligent because this love is in our hearts just waiting to burst free.

In customer service, people who work in stores are taught to keep their heads up. It is too easy to get bogged down in tasks and projects. Many customers need assistance to find items they are looking for, or not looking for, so they can spend money and help service employees make their company money whereby they will earn a paycheck. Keep your heads up, look around for opportunities. Not to sell things, not for your own advantage, but for the advantage of others. Be devoted to their well-being.

In like manner you cannot show this devotion to the well-being of others in your Christian life if your head is down and you are blind to everyone around you. Paul says we need to show devotion to one another in love. Devotion is a strong word. It takes internal strength to always look at others so you can love them. Do not think for even a split second that this means we only need to look up when our fellow believers are around, and we can retreat inward again when a non-believer is near us. Quite the opposite, look even more! While we are scanning the horizon for others, the reach will be incredibly amazing. This is God's desire. There is not a single living soul on this earth who does not deserve this love, without hypocrisy.

No mature Christian could say, with justice, that they cannot love another person. A new believer might, but not a mature Christian. What happens then? When love is held back, shut in, it is quenched by our own fiery hearts. We withhold love whether on purpose or not and we keep it back. Each time it gets easier and easier and soon we fail to realize it, or some might even glory in holding it back! It would be better to be accused of being lazy with love than to be found holding it back with intention. God has given us something incredible! An internal desire to share His love. We often work, throwing up waterproof walls to stop the love from gushing. Not because we want it all to ourselves, but because we simply do not want to give it out. Not only does it become easier and easier to hold it back, but the choice to let it flow becomes harder and harder. This is the hypocrisy that Paul is concerned with. And I believe Paul's main issue is not necessarily the effect hypocrisy has on you, but on the effect it has on others. The effect it has on the witness and message of the gospel. Not only does your own heart turn cold and sour, but you may be the cause of another heart turning the same. Jesus stated in Matthew 23:13 that the pharisees were shutting people out of the Kingdom. Elsewhere, in Matthew 18:6, Jesus said if you turned away a child from him, you would be better off drowning yourself with a millstone around your neck. Seems very harsh but that is the analogy made by the one who desires that all come into the Kingdom. This is how important Paul's admonishment is! Love without hypocrisy and do it with diligence.
